- Our Behavioral Health department has grown the number of pediatric patients receiving mental health services through referrals.

RURAL RESIDENCY

Our ECU Rural Family Medicine Residency Program continued to recruit medical residents that best match the mission of our program here at RCCHC. The ECU Rural Family Medicine Residency Program allows residents to work within our rural community and see the significance of their work.

• By July of 2024, our class size will increase from **2** to **3** residents in each class, growing our resident total to **9**.

SEASONAL AGRICULTURAL TEAM

The RCCHC Migrant Farmworker Outreach team:

- Conducted over **400** visits with agricultural workers, in both the clinic and through our mobile unit.
- Successfully organized **18** outreach events utilizing the mobile unit where they provided care and support to **170** patients.

RCCHC MOBILE CLINIC

- The RCCHC Mobile Health Clinic partnered with Duck Thru convenience stores in our service area to offer free health screenings and on-site provider visits.
- The mobile clinic also partnered with a local substance use treatment center and recently saw **30** patients, providing them with tests for HIV and Hepatitis C. RCCHC offers treatment for these diseases to everyone, even those without insurance.
- The mobile team was featured in a national story about Medicaid Expansion go-live in North Carolina.



NURSING

- Our ECU Home-Based Telehealth Program served more than 80 patients in their homes, providing nutritional, behavioral health, and medication therapy management. This is a service increase of 646% since the program's launch in November 2022.
- RCCHC's Diabetes Eye Screening rate at Ahoskie Comprehensive Care increased from **31**% in 2022 to **44**% in 2023.
- RCCHC was recognized by HRSA in 2023 for advances in Health Information Technology, Quality, COVID-19 vaccinations, having FTCA coverage, and for being a patient-centered medical fixture.



PEDIATRICS

- We treated 5,025 patients in pediatrics and 46 at our School Based Health Center.
- The Pediatrics department obtained a MedPod device that enables providers to see patients virtually.
- We hired a mental health provider to focus on pediatric patients.
- RCCHC's Pediatrics Department was recognized by the North Carolina Breastfeeding Coalition and received the Family Friendly Clinic Award.





SCHOOL BASED SERVICES

The RCCHC School-Based Health Center (SBHC) returned to Hertford County Middle School this year after a three-year COVID hiatus.

The RCCHC staff nurse, Elizabeth Nickert, developed a great rapport with the school nurse and makes frequent rounds in the school to make sure that students and administrators are aware of our services and our presence.





AULANDER DENTAL PROJECT OPENING

- The new integrated care practice will have **8** state-of-the-art dental operatories. All services that RCCHC offers at other sites will be accessible.
- At full operational capacity, the site will be staffed with **3** dentists, **2** hygienists, and other care providers.



NATIONAL HEALTH CENTER WEEK

- We held the first community-wide celebration of patients during National Health Center Week.
- Volunteers from all RCCHC sites and the local community came together to accomplish this monumental event.
- We served over 600 free lunches, gave away hundreds of school supply bags, offered health education booths, and provided take-home food boxes.







NATIONAL HEALTH CENTER WEEK

 Patients were able to meet with local vendors and stakeholders of the community, learn about the services provided by RCCHC, and celebrate the ongoing growth of our health center.

RESOLUTION FROM HERTFORD COUNTY

The Hertford County Board of Commissioners passed a resolution honoring National Health Center Week and presented it to the RCCHC board and staff.

ADVOCACY TRAINING



- RCCHC was recognized as a Gold level Advocacy Center of Excellence by NACHC.





QUALITY


- We met our goal to complete **60**% of Medicare Visits in 2023.
- We completed a total of **2,718** Medicare Visits as compared to **1,015** completed last year.
- We increased staffing for Medicare Wellness and provided 2,666 preventative care visits to our Medicare population.

In addition, RCCHC:

- Dramatically increased diabetic foot examination rates, providing better preventive care for patients living with diabetes;
- Increased our rate of resolved diagnoses, giving more patients answers to questions about their health.

Apprenticeships

 RCCHC joined statewide apprenticeship programs, allowing our staff to simultaneously work and attend school in pursuit of needed certifications.



Medical Assistant Training

• We continued to graduate new Medical Assistant trainees through two different programs: NIMAA and RCCC.



FOOD BANK

- In August 2023, RCCHC and the food bank of the Albermarle launched a partnership to host an Ahoskie Food Bank.
- The food bank provides free vegetables, meats, and other items.
- In the last four months of 2023, we served over
 1,000 members of the community.





MEDICAID EXPANSION

in 2023, North Carolina finally expanded Medicaid. We estimate that up to 2,000 current RCCHC patients and other community members may gain health insurance coverage if they apply.


PROVIDERS

- Al Goddard was featured not once, but twice in local news outlets, showcasing RCCHC's work around Medicaid Expansion.












Gave over 14,158 immunizations



- Compared to 2022, we preformed at or better on 63% of Value-Based Care contract performance measures.
- We expanded Transporting Residents using Innovating Practices (TRIP) program.
- We increased access to Lung and Colorectal Cancer Screening.
- We increase access to the Medication Assisted Treatment (MAT) Program.
- Based on HRSA grant and collaboration with UNC Linberger, we increased Colorectal Cancer screening and prompt follow-up of abnormal FIT screening results.
- RCCHC is a new site for the Southeastern Consortium for Lung Cancer Health Equity, evaluating a navigation intervention to promote lung cancer screening among Black/AA individuals from our community.

Dr. Charles Sawyer has served the Town of Ahoskie community for over 57 years in family primary care, first at Ahoskie Family Physicians and then Roanoke Chowan Community Health Center since its founding nineteen years ago.

Dr. Sawyer received the Diplomate of the American Board of Family Practice certification in 1971 and was named a Fellow of the American Board of Family Practice in 1973.

Dr. Sawyer's commitment to public service extends beyond the health care field to his time volunteering with the Boy Scouts of America, establishing the first Cub Scout Den in Windsor, and was recognized as the 2012 Tri-County District Fried of Scouting's Distinguished Citizen of the Year.

Kim Schwartz 19 years at RCCHC

Beginning in 2005, Kim Schwartz guided RCCHC's growth from a Federally-Qualified Health Center (FQHC) lookalike in one building to its current status as an award-winning, nationally known FQHC with five sites — two of which have pharmacies — one mobile unit, a farmworker outreach team, a school-based health center, and a Dental Integrated Care site being built in Aulander.

The Board of Directors, staff, and patients of RCCHC clinics thank Kim for her many years of service to this community. Board Chair Deborah Morrison said, "There is no question in our minds...Kim's leadership, vision, and support of this work will forever be a foundation we can build upon. The global COVID-19 pandemic was perhaps one of the most challenging periods healthcare institutions have experienced in modern times. Kim's leadership and keen support of the staff was exhibited during COVID, just as it has been demonstrated throughout the organization's growth and expansion".
